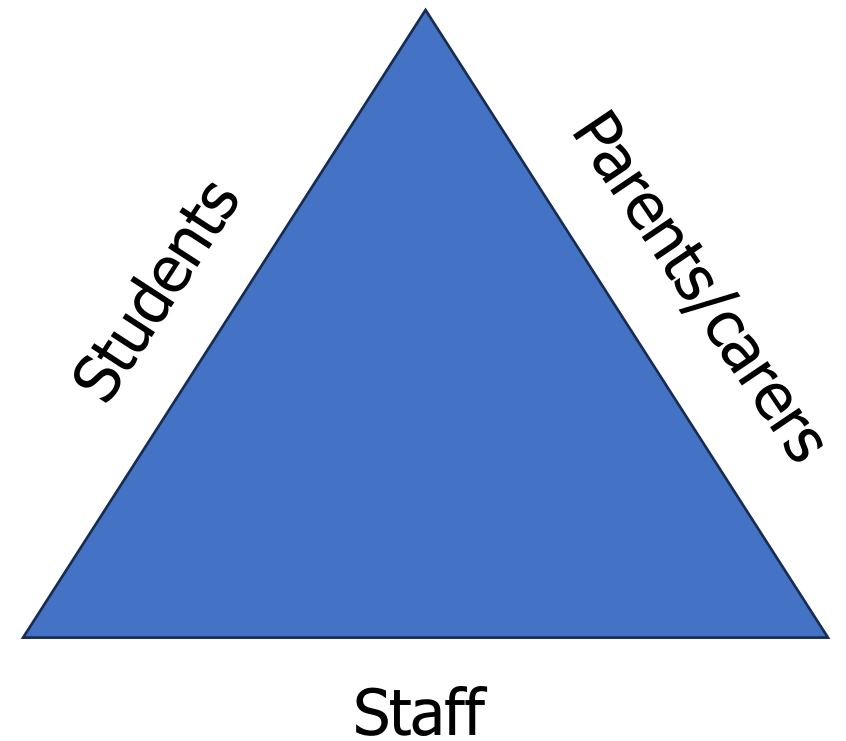

Wellbeing Hub

Further emotional support for students

Staff designated to follow up safety concerns during the school day



Attendance

Managing attendance, absence and illness

SEND Hub

Coordinating support for students with SEND and investigating concerns

- **Coordinating support for students with SEND - EHCP, diagnosed/ evidenced needs and disabilities**
- **Investigating potential learning needs and concerns. For any concerns raised it is a 6-week process of observations a trial of in class support before any support is put in place for students.**
- **Sharing strategies and key information with staff to ensure learning is accessible to all**
- **Training for staff to support quality first teaching for a range of needs such as Dyslexia support, selective mutism etc through adaptive teaching and differentiation.**

- **10 x Learning Support Assistants – responsible for supporting students with an EHCP**
- **Exams access arrangements assessor – testing those who may need additional arrangements for examinations e.g. 25% extra time etc**
- **English as an Additional Language coordinator (EAL) – working closely with students for whom English is not their first language**
- **1 x EAL Support worker**
- **Speech and Language therapy team (External professionals)**
- **Teaching staff – all staff support our students with SEND through adaptive teaching practices.**



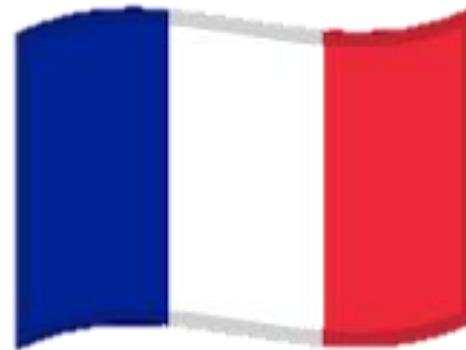


